FAMOUS VIOLINIST COMING.

Otokar Seveik of Prague to Teach American Pupils at Ithaca.

Otokar Sevcik, a famous violinist and teacher, of Prague, according to advices from that city to the Czechoslovak Review, of New York, has decided to follow the example of Leopold Auer, of Petrograd, and come to America. The local Czechoslovak organ says that under the terms of a contract entered into by Sevcik with the Egbert Conservatory, of Ithaca, N. Y., he has agreed to spend six months, beginning Jan, 1 next, instructing American pupils at Ithaca.

Sevcik, who is 68 years old, having been born in Bohemia on March 22, 1852, studied music with his father and at Prague Conservatory, and made his début as a solo player at Vienna in 1873. He is noted, however, for his own pupils in later years, including Kubelik, Kocian, Marie Hall, Carl Ondricek, Sascha Culbertson, Eleanora Jackson and others known in New York, as well as Hugo Heermann, Jr., whose father played here, and Adolph Wilhelmi, son of the virtuoso of that name.
