

CALL FOR PROPOSALS - 2015

IAMP supports projects led by member academies on the basis of merit and following a competitive review process. This call invites applications from IAMP member academies for projects which would run for 12 months, January-December 2016.

For 2016 the IAMP especially encourages applications in our key areas of interest:

- Social determinants of health;
- Urban health;
- One Health;
- Hearing loss;
- Non-communicable diseases (NCDs);
- Antimicrobial resistance;
- Building research capacity;
- Tackling (re-)emerging infectious diseases.

Other topics of relevance to IAMP and listed here: http://www.iamp-online.org/programmes

- 1. Projects should ideally involve more than one member academies and participation from multiple regions is encouraged.
- 2. Projects must NOT be for any form of scientific research, nor can proposals be submitted by an individual (research scientists etc).
- 3. Any partnerships should be through the academy in question, rather than through their research institutes.
- 4. Projects should produce material and/or recommendations that will be useful to the wider IAMP member community (e.g. statements, toolkits or other material a workshop report is NOT considered sufficient on its own).

The maximum for funding has been set at \$25,000 per proposal – higher amounts will however be considered on a case by case basis.

CRITERIA

Project applications will be assessed by reviewers particularly against the following criteria:

- Are the activities, responsibility, goals, budget and engagement of the wider IAMP community clearly planned and described in the proposal, and are there regular and measurable review stages?
- Are the activities, budget and goals proposed realistic and achievable; Can the project partners demonstrate their ability to deliver?
- Are the activities and goals innovative, relevant and meaningful to IAMP, to its strategic plan and to the needs of its broader science academy membership?
